

Built in 1934, the old pumping station was pushed to its limit in April 1998 when it pumped at full capacity for a continuous 50hrs. Any failure then would have meant disaster for 20,000 homes and £3.6 billion-worth of agricultural land. The decision was taken to replace it with the new station capable of pumping 100tonnes of water per second, which was commissioned in April 2011.

Just a few vital statistics:

- It could empty an olympic swimming pool in 25secs
- A Mini-Cooper could fit into each of the 6 pump impellers
- The station can still operate if completely flooded internally
- It is the largest flood defence pumping station in the UK
